

BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING

February 21 2007

CALL TO ORDER: Dr. Beck called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM

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PRESENT: Dr. Beck, Dr. John Straus, Dr. Carl Brownsberger, Gerard Cody and Mark Waksmonski

Minute Review: The Board reviewed the minutes of January 16, 2007. Dr. Straus made a motion to approve the minutes of January 16, 2007, Dr. Brownsberger second the motion and all were in favor.

Old/New Business: Gerard Cody informed the Board of a Flu Clinic to take place at the Arsenal Mall for Thursday 2/22/07 using MRC volunteers. In addition, Karen O'Reilly has filled the ACO/Jr. Sanitarian position since 2/1/07. Dr. Straus introduced the topic of biosafety concerning the Level 4 Laboratory to be built by Boston University. A packet was handed out from the Watertown Citizens for Environmental Safety for review and discussion at the next meeting in March.

Rocco's, 107 Nichols Avenue.: Mr. Waksmonski informed the Board that Mr. Rocky Femino, owner, is representing Rocco's Restaurant. Mr. Waksmonski informed the Board that the applicant had been instructed as to the format of comprehensive inspections and the rules and their responsibilities during comprehensive inspections. Mr. Waksmonski reviewed the physical layout of the establishment with the board. The applicants were also informed that they will receive a 2007 Food Establishment Permit in the mail. A Variance is required for the Mop Sink so that a Hand Wash sink would be used in place of the Mop sink due to physical space limitations. All grey water will be dumped into the toilet after which strict cleaning procedures are followed. After a brief discussion Dr. Straus made a motion to approve the issuance of a 2007 Food Establishment Permit. Dr. Brownsberger seconded the motion and all were in favor

Mobil, 320 Main Street: Mr. Cody informed the Board that Mr. Dionitri is representing Exxon / Mobil. Mr. Cody informed the Board that the applicant had been instructed as to the format of comprehensive inspections and the rules and their responsibilities during

comprehensive inspections. Mr. Cody reviewed the physical layout of the establishment with the board. The applicants were also informed that they will receive a 2007 Food Establishment Permit in the mail. After a brief discussion Dr. Straus made a motion to approve the issuance of a 2007 Food Establishment Permit. Dr. Brownsberger seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Chinese Kitchen, 222 Arsenal Street: Mr. Cody informed the Board Mr. Franklin Yang is representing Chinese Kitchen. Mr. Cody informed the board that the applicant had been instructed as to the format of comprehensive inspections and the rules and their responsibilities during comprehensive inspections. Mr. Cody reviewed the physical layout of the establishment with the board. The applicants were also informed that they will be inspected at least twice a year based on the Potential Hazardous Foods that would be prepared. A Wholesale Permit would be required since no Retail Sale of Food would take place at this location.

A+A Auto Repair, 81 Elm Street Mr. Cody informed the board that Mr. Antranik Helvadjin is representing A+A Auto Repair. Mr. Antranik is requesting a Hazardous Materials Permit from the Board of Health. Mr. Cody stated that the applicant had completed all the requirements necessary to obtain a permit to store Hazardous Materials. After a brief discussion Dr. Straus made a motion to approve the issuance of a 2006-2007 Hazardous Material Permit. Dr. Brownsberger seconded the motion and all were in favor.

162 Arlington Street: Ms. McNair informed the Board that she is the Permanent Guardian for Ms. D'Allano. It was noted that Ms. D'Alanno is currently at the West Newton Health and Rehabilitation Center in Newton , MA.

EP Update/Special Populations: Mr. Cody gave an overview of the January 9, 2007 Special Populations meeting. The focus of the meeting was on a presentation by the Elder Subcommittee and the "all hazards binder" as a guideline.
